Carole Champalaune has joined the Investigation Services with the position of deputy rapporteur general. She replaces Stanislas Martin, who has been appointed to lead the regulation and security service at the Directorate General for Competition, Consumer Affairs and Fraud Control (DGCCRF). The Autorité expresses its thanks to the latter for all of his work.

A graduate of the Institut d'études politiques in Paris, law graduate and former student of the École nationale de la magistrature, Carole Champalaune began her career as a trial judge in Senlis (1988-1989). As a substitute at the central administration of the Ministry of Justice between 1990 and 1994, she was a case officer for the Conseil de la concurrence, the predecessor of the Autorité de la concurrence, from 1994 to 1999. As an assistant judge at the Cour de Cassation (Supreme Court), she followed the litigation surrounding competition from 1999 to 2004, within the commercial, financial and economic law chamber, before being appointed as counsel to the First president of the Cour de Cassation between 2004 and 2007. In 2007, she was appointed as first vice president of the Ordinary court of first instance in Strasbourg, in charge of the management and coordination of the commercial department.

Under the authority of the Rapporteur General, Virginie Beaumeunier, she will take over the management of one of the Investigation Services.
