Performance & Battery: Powered by the new 3-nanometer chip, iPhone 17 delivers faster processing, more efficient power usage, and enhanced graphics performance. This upgrade makes a noticeable difference for gaming, video editing, and tasks involving machine learning features.

Battery life is improved too — users can expect all-day use, with up to 30 hours of video playback. Charging is faster as well, reaching about 50 % in 20 minutes with a suitable high-wattage charger.

Software & Connectivity: iPhone 17 comes with the recently released, bringing updated interface design, new system-level features, and enhanced privacy. Under the hood, a new wireless module — — enables modern connectivity standards like Wi-Fi 7, Bluetooth 6, and Thread, delivering better wireless performance and reliability.

Availability and Pricing at Launch

The base model of iPhone 17 started at US\$799, matching the price point of iPhone 16. But unlike previous generations, the starting storage option was doubled: the base model offers 256 GB, with a 512 GB variant also available.

Pre-orders began September 12 in many regions, with full availability starting September 19, 2025. The rollout covers dozens of countries worldwide; availability in some regions — especially outside the U.S. — may vary slightly in timing.
