- 256 GB starts at US \$999
- 512 GB US \$1,199
- 1 TB US \$1,399

These prices reflect standard unlocked, SIM-free models.

Colors offered include Space Black, Cloud White, Sky Blue, and Light Gold.

Because iPhone Air is sold globally, its retail price in a given country depends on local taxes, import duties, and regional pricing policy. For example, in some markets price may be higher than base U.S. price.

- **Storage-based pricing jump:** Upgrading from 256 GB to 1 TB can add several hundred dollars, making high-capacity models quite expensive.

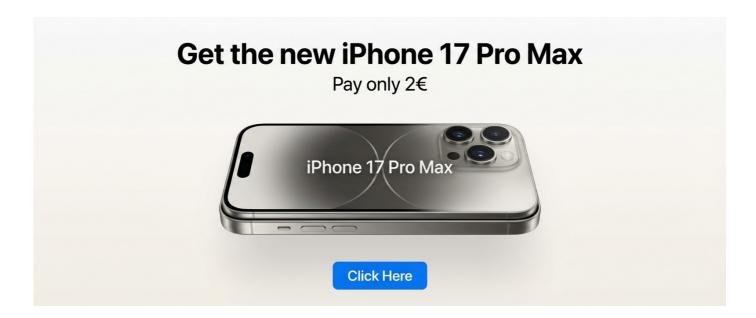
Should you buy iPhone Air—who it's for
