Minimal bezel and screen/camera lip. Many thin cases lack the raised edges that help keep the display or camera from touching a table or floor. That's fine for scratches or light use — but less ideal if you often place the phone facedown or drop it.

Not suited for heavy-duty environments. If you often drop your phone, work outdoors, commute frequently, or expose it to rough surfaces (concrete, gravel, construction sites, etc.), a super-thin case might give you a false sense of security. For those conditions, a more robust, shock-resistant case is wiser.
