- If you don't need high-end camera/video features everyday tasks and casual photography likely won't justify the high cost.
- If you're price-sensitive CAD 1,749 (base model) is a substantial investment, and higher storage tiers push the price quite high.
- If you prefer a physical SIM slot in Canada, the iPhone 17 Pro Max is offered as an eSIM-only model, which might be a factor depending on your carrier or travel needs.
