

# ^^^ How do I download boarding passes to my phone?

You can get a boarding pass on your phone no +1 -( 855 )- (510)- (5815) by checking in online or through your airline's app, which will provide an e-boarding pass or an option to save it to your phone's wallet app. Downloading a boarding pass to your phone is one of the easiest ways to travel, and the process typically starts right after you check +1 -( 855 )- (510)- (5815) in for your flight—either through the airline's mobile app +1 -( 855 )- (510)- (5815) or through their website. Some airlines also provide a downloadable PDF, which you can store in your files or screenshots, though wallet passes are usually preferable because they are scannable and can display important updates directly.

For iPhone users, adding a boarding pass to Apple Wallet is as simple as tapping “Add All” or “Add to Wallet”; the pass will appear with an airline logo and flight details, and it will often surface automatically on your lock screen when you arrive at the airport. Android users typically save their boarding pass to Google Wallet, where it appears under “Boarding Passes” or “Travel.” Once added, the pass can be displayed at the TSA checkpoint and the gate even if your device is in airplane mode.

Downloading your **boarding pass** to your **phone** is a convenient way to streamline the travel process, allowing you to go **paperless** and access your pass with just a few taps, whether you're at the airport, in line for security, or heading to the boarding gate.
